## SCHOOL NEWS

Governor DeWine is strongly recommending universal mask-wearing, at least through the next few weeks, and recommending vaccinations.

Currently, all counties are "red", and all are at or above the threshold of 100 cases per 100,000. (Ashtabula is at 100.) In addition 98.5 hospitalizations in Ohio for COVID right now are unvaccinated people.

- For these reasons, we are asking all students and adults who have not been vaccinated to wear masks in the school building. When the students are working quietly at their desks, which are spaced 3 feet apart, they will be permitted to take their masks down. When working in small groups or traveling through the building, they will be directed to wear the mask. Teachers, vaccinated and unvaccinated, will wear masks when working with small groups or individuals in close proximity. No masks will be worn during lunch or recess. We will split the lunch groups, so half the school is on the playground and the other half is eating lunch with social distancing of 6 feet. Teachers will inform students when to put their masks on and off.
- Wearing a mask protects others as well as the wearer. The mission of St. James School is to serve God by loving one another. Wearing a mask, at this time, appears to be the loving thing to do.
- It is a State of Ohio mandate that all students wear masks on the bus.
- We will be taking temperatures in the morning again this year as a safety measure.
- We will keep up the hand-washing routines.
- Students should bring their own water bottle with fresh water every day.
- Sanitation of surfaces throughout the building will be continued daily.
- Once again, we will be limiting the number of visitors in the school at this time.

This is a continuously evolving situation. The medical community is doing their best to give advice, but we are all navigating uncharted territory. Please read parent newsletters throughout the year for changes and updates in policies. We will try to keep you up to date on the latest information as we receive it.

You will receive a packet of forms from the office on the first day of school. Forms are due Friday, Aug 27. We will have an ice cream party on Thursday, Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup> for the children who have turned in the forms by 8/27.

### FREE LUNCH

Be sure to complete the lunch form indicating whether your children qualify for free or reduced lunch. We need the information in order to receive state and federal funding. At the beginning of the year, ALL student lunches will be FREE until we receive further notice.
