PAX GOOD BEHAVIOR GAME



In June, our teachers participated in PAX positive behavior intervention training, which was made possible by a grant from the State of Ohio. In Latin, Pax means Peace. In Christian churches, it refers to a ceremonial kiss, especially at a baptism or Eucharistic service, as a token of Christian love and unity. The PAX good behavior program creates classrooms in which love and unity become

The PAX behavior program is a preventive intervention used by teachers and schools to teach self-regulation, self-management, and social awareness in young people. When adults are equipped with the strategies to teach these skills to children in addition to academics, they create a nurturing environment that impacts

the focus of every activity.

positive brain development in young people with astounding lifetime effects. These effects have a dramatic impact on children, schools, and communities.

PAX trains teachers to create classrooms and schools focused on peace, productivity, health and happiness. Training children to be PAX Leaders empowers and motivates them to be better persons and together create a better world.



The children have already created a vision of what they want their classroom to be. They are striving to be PAX leaders by following the behaviors they want to see in their classrooms. When they play the PAX game and practice the skills that build a peaceful, productive, happy, and healthy environment, they earn rewards from Grannys' Wacky prize bag.



You can be involved by asking them how they were PAX leaders in school each day. Ask them how it made them feel. If it involved a classmate ask how the classmate might have felt.

The children are writing PAX notes when they see a classmate showing PAX behaviors. The notes are taped on the classroom door and then placed in the Offertory basket during Mass. In this way, they offer their good works to God and the whole community.

FACTS

All the schools in the Diocese are now using the FACTS School Information System. This system replaces OptionC. We have been trained to use it but have experienced many technical bugs that need to be worked out. Please be patient as we work with the FACTS team to fix the problems. When the system is ready, we will send instructions for you to view your child's progress.

UNIFORM CODE

This year Physical Education is on Fridays so there is no Mass uniform. Instead the children should wear their Gym t-shirt with nylon or cotton sports shorts or pants.
