Message from the Principal:

Dear Parents,

The Fruit of the Spirit for November is "Peace". During the Last Supper, Jesus said to his disciples, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give you." — John 14:27. When he saw them next, after rising from the dead, he again said, "Peace be with you" (Luke 24:36). During their darkest hour, as they were caught in the grips of terror and confusion, peace was the gift Christ gave to His disciples.

But what IS peace?



Peace is staying calm even when things are bad, scary or seem impossible. We don't have to fear or worry because we trust God. When we keep spending time with God by reading the Bible and praying, we grow in peace! The Bible actually tells us "do not worry"

about anything, but pray and ask God for everything you need. And when you pray, always give thanks. And God's peace will keep your heart and mind on Jesus. This peace that God gives is so great, we can't even understand it" (Philippians 4:6-7).

Ms. Reece provided the teachers with information on helping students cultivate peace in their lives. In the classrooms, the teachers are setting up Calm Corners where students can go if they are anxious or upset. The teachers are helping the students identify their emotions and practice coping skills such as taking deep breaths, praying, meditating, using a stress ball, blowing bubbles, drawing, or writing about their feelings.

We are also beginning a program titled "Strong Kids". The program is provided by the Sisters of Charity Foundation for the Catholic Schools in Stark County. The purpose of Strong Kids is to promote children's mental health by focusing on Social and Emotional Learning. SEL is a process that teaches young people how to apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions, and achieve personal goals.

As we approach the holiday season, I pray that you may experience the peace that comes from knowing God walks with you every step in your journey through life. May you take the time to feel God's presence and peace within and around you each day, Kathy Kettler
